You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Objectives The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional interest payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the **underlying**. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the **maturity date**, unless terminated early. If, at maturity, the **underlying** has fallen below the **barrier level**, the product may return less than the **product notional amount** or even zero.

(Terms that appear in **bold** in this section are described in more detail in the table(s) below.)

Early termination following an autocall: The product will terminate prior to the **maturity date** if, on any **autocall observation date**, the **reference level** is at or above the **autocall barrier level**. On any such early termination, you will on the immediately following **autocall payment date** receive, in addition to any final interest payment, a cash payment equal to the autocall payment of GBP 1.00. Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the **maturity date** you will receive:

- if the **final reference level** is at or above the **barrier level**, a cash payment equal to GBP 1.00; or
- if the **final reference level** is below the **barrier level**, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the **underlying**. The cash payment will equal (i) the **product notional amount** multiplied by (ii) (A) the **final reference level** divided by (B) the **strike level**.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlying**, the product and the product issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.



2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk: If the currency of the product is different from the currency of the country in which you live, you will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get will depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. Recommended holding period: 8 years
